## MESSAGE FROM THE REGIONAL CO-CHAIRS

Dear Governor Hochul,


On behalf of the Mid-Hudson Regional Economic Development Council (MHREDC), we are pleased to present our 2022 Annual Report. As the region continues to rebound from the devastating effects of the COVID – 19 pandemic, New York State and the Mid-Hudson Region show positive signs of an economic recovery. The region has regained many of the jobs lost as the unemployment rate for May 2022 was at **2.9%**, which is strong when put in contrast to the statewide unemployment rate at 4.1%. This is a night-and-day difference than the pre-pandemic regional unemployment rate of March 2020 at 4.2% and the all-time high we experienced in April 2020 at **14.2%**.

As outlined in last year’s annual report, this economic recovery has been shaped in large part due to the MHREDC Regional Strategy of **LIVE, WORK and PLAY**. Thanks to your leadership, more than **\$818.3 million** has been awarded to the Mid-Hudson region through Rounds I-XI of the Regional Economic Development Council Initiative. This effort has supported **1,054 projects** that we are pleased to report **86.5%** are either complete or progressing; where every \$1 in state funds awarded has leveraged \$8.20 in private funding; generating more than **\$4.1 billion** of economic activity and projected to create and retain nearly **24,000 jobs**. It is worth noting that in 2021, the Mid-Hudson region received more than \$104.8 million in New York State economic development awards. That is the highest award amount of any single year in the Mid-Hudson Region’s history and a clear indication that the regional economy is surging as projects are coming back online after prior uncertainty.

It goes without saying that the **LIVE, WORK and PLAY** strategy is what benefitted the region pre-pandemic and has served as an economic guide out of the pandemic. This is evidenced by the influx of new residents who have moved into the area attracted by what the region has to offer. This dramatic population increase is only being experienced by a few regions in the state, which brings about its own challenges and local pressures that we must now contend with as the recovery has not been equitable for everyone. While unemployment rates remain low, unfilled job postings remain high and there’s clear data to show that there’s a mismatch between job seekers and job providers.

As such, the MHREDC has put together a Regional Workforce Inventory focusing on certain priority regional tradeable sectors, along with a skills-gap analysis and identified barriers to employment, to help focus workforce development efforts where everyone is able to participate in this economic resurgence. In closing, the Mid-Hudson Region has made great gains since the early days of COVID-19. Now we must ensure that this new economic opportunity extends to all and leaves no one behind. The MHREDC looks forward to the good work ahead in Round XII to achieve these goals together.

# Executive Summary



## The Mid-Hudson Regional Economic Development Council continues to pinpoint strategic investments that will help the state unleash the talent and creativity of our workforce, and support new and expanding businesses within its seven-county region.

The council's work in 2022 comes amid several transitions for the region. Communities and businesses across the Mid-Hudson were constrained by the COVID-19 pandemic for nearly two years. We believe the region has emerged from that health crisis with a restless energy that can be channeled toward new investments, innovations, and workforce development. The state and the council stand ready to work with project sponsors who will create additional jobs in the region and add to the positive momentum that has revitalized our diverse communities.

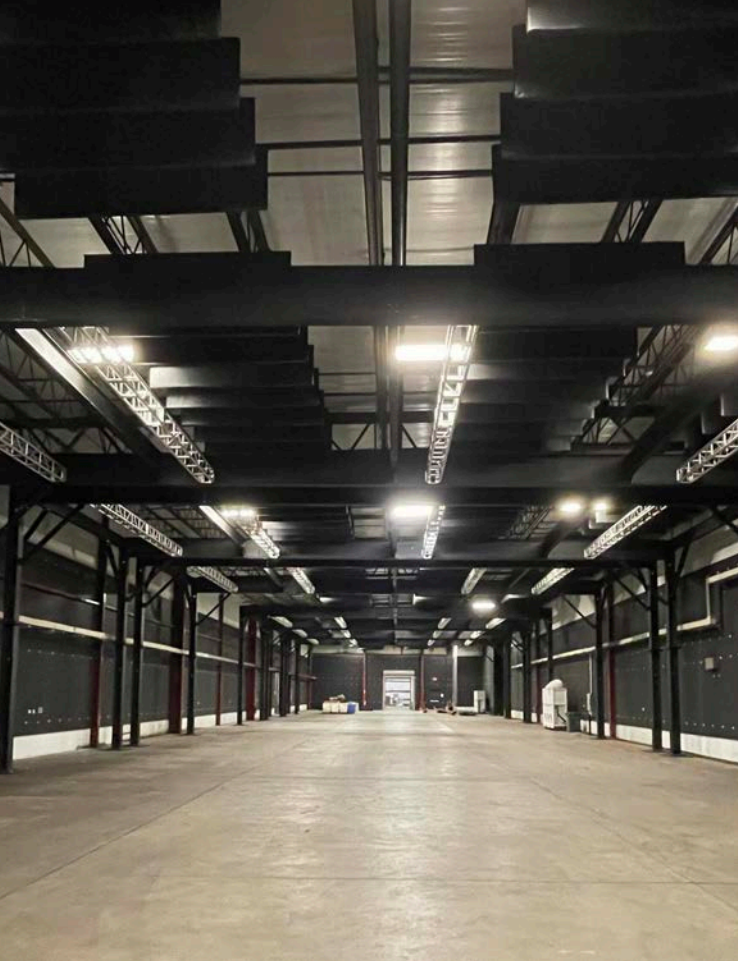
We must also recognize that a significant workforce transition is happening across the Mid-Hudson Region. Our workforce is influenced by many factors, but the pandemic and a growing wave of retirements among workers from the Baby Boomer generation are the two most influential now. Thousands of our neighbors were moving toward retirement in the immediate years before the pandemic, and thousands more chose to retire when the novel coronavirus changed the health risk or functional dynamics of their jobs.

The pandemic and inflation have also changed what people want and expect from their jobs. The majority of job seekers said that larger paychecks

were their top priority before the pandemic. But a recent survey by the state shows that workers are thinking differently. They still want – and in many cases expect – higher pay for their labor, but schedule flexibility, time off, and remote work have surpassed compensation as the top priority for a large portion of the workforce.

The Mid-Hudson is changing in other ways, too. Thousands of people moved into the region during the pandemic, including nearly **40,000** people who moved into the region from the New York City metro area. The region is seeing a significant uptick in attention and investment along its main streets, as the younger generation seeks walkable communities that have arts, entertainment, restaurants and other amenities that bind the fabric of strong communities.

All of this activity means that our Mid-Hudson Region is brimming with challenges and opportunities. The council remains focused on pinpointing the best solutions and investments it can find, all while keeping its focus on the core mission to make our region an undeniably attractive place to **LIVE, WORK** and **PLAY**.

Through this strategy, the Council also encourages development in its downtowns, which are popular with regional visitors and residents, further implementing the state priority of placemaking.

- Enhance the natural, historic, and cultural assets of the region, resulting in improved quality of life for residents and increasing tourism in the region.
- Grow the tourism industry in a way that is balanced and sustainable.
- Establish sustainable growth for the MHREDC's Regional Economic Cluster Plan – the food and beverage manufacturing supply chain.

# State of the Region

The Mid-Hudson Region is home to approximately 2.4 million people who live in diverse communities that include urban centers, historic hamlets and villages, and rural towns. The region comprises a workforce of nearly 800,000 people. It includes several industry sectors that are strong and growing. These include biotech and life sciences, agribusiness and craft beverage, tourism, advanced manufacturing and logistics, film and television production, information technology, and financial and professional services. A large percentage of Mid-Hudson residents are also employed in education and healthcare, which remain two of the strongest employment sectors in the region.

The region has emerged from the pandemic with many challenges and opportunities. Some of these are new, but some are longer-term issues that have been improved or exacerbated by recent circumstances, including regional migration, inflation, increased tourism, and a steady stream

of investment into the region's downtowns and commercial corridors.

Housing is perhaps the biggest challenge facing the Mid-Hudson now. Over the past five years, the median price of a single-family home has more than doubled in some parts of the region. This trend was given rocket fuel by the pandemic, which caused more people to move into the Mid-Hudson and pay more than the asking price for homes. The inventory of homes for sale is unusually low, with most counties having three months of inventory or fewer. The high cost and low inventory of homes has pushed many people into the rental market, including thousands who would ordinarily qualify to own a home. In turn, this has pushed up rents. The dual crises of housing availability and affordability means that too many of our neighbors are paying more than 30-50 percent of their income on housing costs. This constrains them from participating in our regional economy in other ways, including through the purchase of goods and services, and it leaves them vulnerable to secondary challenges from health care costs and other large expenditures.

The Mid-Hudson must recognize that our housing challenges are also economic challenges. A region that does not have an adequate supply of affordable housing will also have trouble sustaining a workforce to meet the needs of its businesses. Therefore, the Council and the state must continue to examine its role in promoting and supporting more housing for the region.

Although the pandemic exacerbated the Mid-Hudson housing crisis, it also brought new people and investment to the region. Data released in 2022 by the Internal Revenue Service showed that during the first year of the pandemic more people migrated into the region than out of it for the first time in more than a decade. That included a net inflow of more than 33,000 people from New York City. Our new neighbors – many of whom initially came to the Mid-Hudson to escape the early coronavirus health risks associated with density – brought creativity, new skills, investment, and their families to our region. The Council and regional leaders should seek to understand what our new residents enjoy about the

region, how we can keep them here, and how we can attract and retain more people in the future.

Other opportunities abound within the region. A renewed interest in walkable living has resulted in a pattern of reinvestment across our small cities, villages and hamlets. New restaurants, craft beverage businesses, retail stores and other merchants are occupying space in buildings that had long been vacant. These activities have been spurred along by the work of the Council and the state, a strong footing set by community arts, and entrepreneurs who see opportunities along our main streets.

As investment brings new life to our downtowns, other commercial spaces have emptied out. This is especially true for commercial office space within the region. Many workers who occupied office space were sent to work from home during the pandemic – and many companies plan to continue remote or hybrid work for the foreseeable future. Commercial realtors report that more than 50 percent of the Class A office space, especially in the southern portions of our region, remain vacant, and a small percentage of that is expected to be reoccupied anytime soon. This challenge should also be viewed as an opportunity. The modular, adaptable construction of these office spaces make them ripe for adaptive re-use. The Council and its partners should play an active role in reimagining these spaces and how they might meet other regional needs.

As we focus on making the region a great place to live and work, we must also recognize that an increasing number of people enjoy their time to play in the Mid-Hudson. Tourism in our region has steadily risen since the Great Recession of 2008, when a trend toward so-called staycations caused more people to visit resorts, agribusinesses and other destinations in the Mid-Hudson. During the pandemic, our region was seen as an escape – a place where people from the New York City metro area, weary of pandemic restrictions, could safely get outside to enjoy some time with their families. This uptick in visitation provides an opportunity for our tourism businesses to grow and help drive the regional economy.

## Regional Workforce Inventory

To create an environment in which businesses can thrive, the state and the council must focus on workforce issues. These include trends in the regional workforce, issues related to workforce misalignment or training needs, and wraparound services that are necessary to support job seekers and employers.

This report includes a significant analysis of regional workforce data and needs. This information was compiled from a survey of employers and job seekers conducted by the State of New York in 2022, statistics from the state Department of Labor, and interviews with county workforce experts. The inventory found several employment sectors in which the demand for employees is outpacing the supply. These include agribusiness, craft beverage and tourism; biotech and healthcare, and the construction trades, just to name a few. The analysis also found that employers and job applicants are seeking much of the same training. The workforce needs more digital skills and computer literacy, mechanical and trade skills, and administrative skills that cut across all industry sectors.

The quantitative and qualitative information gathered for this report also found that many of the employment gaps can be filled by people without a college degree. This underscores that our region is failing to connect employers with job seekers across many employment sectors that do not require a college education. The survey found that many job seekers, including those from disadvantaged communities, are eager to fill these positions. The state and the Council must determine how to train this untapped workforce, and the wraparound services that are necessary to support them. Transportation, childcare, and access to technology stood out as three supports that the majority of job seekers needed.

A deeper inventory and analysis of regional workforce needs is included in Section 2 of this report. This guidance will be used for the allocation of state funds support workforce training for key employment sectors in the Mid-Hudson Region.

## Previously Funded CFA Awards

Of the 1,054 awards that have been granted to Mid-Hudson projects through the Consolidated Funding Application (CFA) process since 2011, 86.5% are complete or progressing and are projected to generate economic activity of more than \$4.1 billion. The state investments have been strategic, designed to have a strong return on investment. Every \$1 of state investment in Mid-Hudson CFA projects since 2011 is projected to generate \$8.20 in economic activity. This has positive ripple effects across the region and across industries, impacting the lives of the Mid-Hudson's diverse residents and businesses.

The Council identified 158 of the projects as priorities for the region due to their strong alignment with the regional strategy and statewide initiatives. Of these, 77% are complete or progressing and are projected to generate more than **\$1.8 billion** in economic activity. The leverage ratio (total project cost to total CFA award amount) is 15.4:1, again showcasing how the MHREDC has maximized the return on investment for the state's awards.

## Participation

The MHREDC has continued to expand its outreach throughout the seven-county Mid-Hudson Region through its four work groups, meetings, presentations, and participating in local and regional business and economic development events. In total, these activities reached more than 2,800 participants across various sectors and industries.

## Looking Ahead

The MHREDC is looking forward to reviewing project proposals submitted through the CFA for the 12th round of the REDC initiative, and once again will be seeking projects that advance the regional strategy and statewide priorities. The Council will continue monitoring the region's recovery from the effects of COVID-19, and its four work groups – **LIVE, WORK, PLAY**, and **WORKFORCE** - with their integration of stakeholders throughout the region playing an integral role.

Through the **LIVE, WORK, PLAY** strategy, the Council will ensure the state's investments will continue to spur growth regionally. In this post-pandemic economy, the leveraging of private, federal, and municipal resources is a critical element to advancing the strategies in the Mid-Hudson Region.

# Regional Workforce Inventory

# Priority Regional Employment Sectors

Each region across the State of New York identified industries and employment sectors that would benefit from workforce development efforts. Priority sectors were determined by the Mid-Hudson Regional Economic Development Council, and workforce development supports were identified by using three sources of information:

- 1) A survey of employers and job seekers conducted by the State of New York in 2022.
- 2) Statistics from the state Department of Labor, updated to 2022, detailing trends within industry sectors and other useful data.
- 3) Qualitative data from interviews with county workforce offices and economic development departments, whose managers have met once a month for nearly two years as part of a Job Connections Task Force run by Hudson Valley Pattern for Progress.

The Mid-Hudson Region has paid close attention to sectors in which the demand for employees is outpacing the supply of workers, growth industries within the region.

## The following employment sectors were identified as priorities for workforce investment in the Mid-Hudson Region:

### Biotech and Life Sciences

Biotech and Life Sciences remain an important job sector for the Hudson Valley. The number of people employed in this sector nearly doubled between the years 2016-2021, and evidence suggests growth will continue here as long as workforce development efforts continue to supply skilled employees for this sector. That is why workforce development efforts should continue to focus here.

The region must also recognize that jobs in Biotech and Life Sciences share a complementary relationship and are only viable because of the significant healthcare industry that exists in the Mid-Hudson. Job growth in the Mid-Hudson Region was led by healthcare in the two years before the pandemic – a trend that is likely to continue because of the region’s aging population.

Data and interviews show there is a need for additional healthcare workers across the region. A survey of those looking for work in the region found that 11 percent were looking for jobs in healthcare – the largest of any industry sector in the survey. At the same time, employers said that nurses and social workers were among the most difficult-to-fill positions in the Mid-Hudson. Workforce development leaders also noted that the regional demand for healthcare workers was outpacing the supply. In some parts of the region, an estimated 40 percent of all job postings were for jobs in the healthcare sector.

Workforce development efforts for the healthcare sector should support the full range of healthcare jobs – doctors, registered nurses, licensed practical nurses, certified nursing assistants, medical assistants, home health aides, respiratory therapists, and emergency medical technicians. Careful attention should be paid to home health aides and emergency medical technicians. Authorities within the region cited a critical shortage of these workers.

### Agribusiness, Craft Beverage and Tourism

The Mid-Hudson Region is known for its world-class farm products, restaurants, breweries, wineries, resorts, and tourism destinations. These employment sectors have many synergies, including the common struggle to find workers after the height of the pandemic. Data point to a dwindling interest in these jobs among those seeking work. In 2021, for example, 11 percent of job seekers had worked in food service and tourism, but only 6 percent said they wanted another job in that employment sector.

A recent shortage of workers has plagued these industries. Many restaurants across the region have been forced into temporary closures because there are not enough cooks, dishwashers and wait-staff to run their eateries. Some of the region’s signature resorts have been forced to temporarily reduce their bookings, and shutter portions of their hotels, because they lack the staff to maintain and service their entire properties.

A scarcity of workers comes despite a surge in demand for value-added farm products, restaurants, craft beverage businesses and tourism destinations across the region. The Mid-Hudson Region has experienced considerable growth in visitation from residents of the New York City metropolitan area – a trend that was given rocket fuel by the pandemic. Interest in the local food, drink and tourism across the Mid-Hudson will continue to be strong, which underscores the need for strategic workforce investments in this sector.

## Advanced Manufacturing and Logistics

Employers noted a strong demand for skilled workers in advanced manufacturing, warehouses, and drivers with CDL licenses to support these industry sectors. Specifically, employers statewide listed warehouse workers and CDL drivers among their top 10 most-difficult-to-fill positions in the 2022 survey. For the Mid-Hudson, these positions are interrelated, although many industries outside warehousing need CDL drivers as part of their industries.

The warehouse industry is expanding significantly along the Route 87 and Route 84 corridors, but many are struggling to find enough workers to operate and manage the warehouses. Several new warehouse projects are in the approval pipeline, which could exacerbate the shortage that local workforce experts say exists already. The same is true for advanced manufacturing, which is likely to grow in the region through the adaptive reuse of industrial buildings. This will yield a greater demand for skilled manufacturing workers.

Every county across the region also noted a shortage of drivers with a CDL license. A CDL license is needed for the tractor-trailers that ship goods from our region's warehouses and manufacturing businesses, and they are also needed to operate heavy transport vehicles, construction equipment and more. The 2022 survey of job seekers and employers revealed helpful synergy on the topic of CDL licenses – job seekers listed a CDL license as the fourth most-in-demand skill, and employers listed it as the fourth most-difficult-to-fill position. Focusing workforce training here would make sense, since it is a skill that both workers and employers are looking for.

Lastly, job in logistics and other sectors require significant support from information technology (IT) experts. Jobs in IT have grown across the Mid-Hudson by nearly 7 percent over the past five years. That growth is likely to continue as more than 25 percent of employers surveyed in 2022 said they expected digital automation to expand within their businesses over the next several years. Job seekers are keen to this trend, as software and hardware skills made up four of the top five training interests among those looking for work in the same 2022 survey.

The ubiquity of digital systems – and the need to be diligent about cybersecurity – means that IT workers will be embedded in practically every workplace across

New York in the coming years. Still, county workforce offices report that many employers are struggling to find an ample number of candidates for these jobs.

## Financial and Professional Services

Regional workforce data and interviews with county workforce experts point toward a shortage of workplace administrative staff and management training across the Mid-Hudson Region. Businesses said that administrative staff and managers or projects managers were among the hardest employees to find. At the same time, job seekers listed management and administrative training among the top 10 skills they were looking to learn.

The need for administrators and managers is particularly connected to Financial & Professional Services, although jobs that require these skills cut across practically every industry sector. Employer survey data point to issues with succession planning as part of the need for additional managers and administrators. The entire workforce across the Mid-Hudson would benefit from programs that develop the next generation of administrators and managers.

**Construction trades** – The priority industry sectors identified by the Mid-Hudson Regional Economic Development Council cannot grow or expand upon their success without an adequate supply of laborers, carpenters, mechanics and other skilled workers in the construction trades. These were among the jobs that employers in the Mid-Hudson listed as the 15 most difficult to recruit. Machine operators, electricians and welders were also in high demand across the state and the region.

Interest in the construction trades is also strong among job seekers. Of more than 8,000 people surveyed across the state in 2022, 8 percent said they were looking for jobs in construction – the second highest after healthcare. Workforce experts across the Mid-Hudson verified the data, noting that retirements among the older cohort of construction workers will result in more openings for laborers, carpenters, electricians, plumbers and other professionals in the years ahead. Our state, federal and local governments have also increased their investment in infrastructure in recent years, which will prompt the construction of additional projects that require these skilled workers.

The region would also benefit from training and recruiting additional engineers, which are closely



connected to the construction and utility sectors. The Mid-Hudson Region has few institutions with accredited training programs for mechanical, civil and other types of engineering. This leaves the region at a competitive disadvantage, often attempting to recruit engineers that are trained at four-year colleges in New York City or the Capital District.

## In-Demand Skill Sets Needs

Workforce development efforts must account for the skills and training that are in highest demand and [necessary to support the priority sectors in the Mid-Hudson Region](#). The in-demand skills listed below were identified through the 2022 employer survey conducted by the State of New York, and through conversations with county workforce development experts across the region.

The state and region should consider these high-demand skills when scoring workforce development proposals to support out priority sectors.

**Digital skills and computer literacy** – Employers ranked computer skill and digital literacy highest among the skills lacking within the candidate pool. At the same time, job seekers listed these as the skills for which they wanted training.

**Mechanical and trade skills** – One out of every five employers in the state said it was difficult to find job candidates with adequate mechanical skills. Manufacturing, warehouse, and construction jobs across the region require specialized training for electricians, plumbers, machine operators and more.

**Administrative skills** – The 2022 survey of job seekers and employers found that administrative skills were in high demand by both groups. Employers listed communication skills, attention to detail, time management, typing and computer literacy – all key to administration – as those lacking among applicants. These skills are needed to support every priority sector in the Mid-Hudson.

**Customer service skills** – Nearly 20 percent of employers said they were seeking job candidates with better customer service skills. The need for this broad skill set is underscored by the unmet demand for employees in the restaurant, craft beverage and tourism sectors.

**Driving** – This in-demand skill cuts across many data from the 2022 survey. A total of 15 percent of job seekers said they did not have reliable transportation to get to work; and 27 percent of employers said they were turned away from job candidates because they lacked a driver's license. At the same time, CDL licenses were in high demand among employers and job seekers. The survey makes clear that more driver training is needed to match employers and candidates across the Mid-Hudson. Agribusiness, advanced manufacturing and logistics, construction and other priority sectors require drivers with CDL licenses.

**Leadership and project management** – The 2022 survey shows that employers are looking for the next generation of managers and project managers. These jobs are listed among the most difficult to fill by employers, and the specific skills they require – time management, critical thinking, leadership – are noted as non-technical skills that are lacking among candidates.

# Populations for Workforce Training

The quantitative and qualitative data that were gathered for the Mid-Hudson Region found a few populations that would benefit from workforce training. In some cases, workforce training would benefit these populations by allowing them to fill jobs that are in high demand by local employers. In other cases, workforce training would provide them with upward mobility within their employment sector, clearing space at the lower ranks of employment for entry-level or younger employees. Survey data and interviews revealed the following populations for whom workforce training is most needed: Job seekers without a college degree – The Mid-Hudson Region is failing to connect employers with job seekers across many employment sectors that do not require a college degree. This includes construction trades, utilities, hospitality and tourism, and certain jobs within healthcare and administration. Our neighbors who do not have a college degree remain an underappreciated, and often untapped, source of skilled labor across the region. In fact, more than 53 percent of Mid-Hudson residents over the age of 25 do not have a college degree. In the state’s 2022 survey of job seekers, 55 percent of those looking for work did not graduate from a college program.

This population of job seekers would benefit from training that could help them fill many of the necessary, honorable jobs that are going unfilled in our communities. The region would also benefit from identifying and engaging with these potential job seekers while they are still in high school so that they can be pointed toward good-paying, in-demand fields that do not require college. Efforts to reach this population early in their working lives should be supported.

**Disadvantaged residents of cities and villages** – The workforce within the Mid-Hudson’s cities and villages often goes untapped because of challenges related to transportation. However, many people living in our urban centers are eager to be trained to work at employment centers that exist just outside the boundaries of the municipality where they live. Training for these job seekers – paired with additions or adjustments to our transportation systems – would be a prudent investment.

**Employees seeking upward mobility within a sector** – Many employees working within an industry are seeking upward mobility within that sector. Healthcare is a good example. Certified nursing assistants are often looking to become registered nurses, or emergency medical technicians might want to be educated as radiology technicians. In many cases, additional coursework at a local college, or a certificate program, can help employees ascend through the ranks of a sector in which they are already working. This helps the region in two ways – by helping these workers advance in their careers, and by making room for employees who want the jobs they currently occupy.

**Retired workers** – Many of our retired workers across the region are still eager to work, but perhaps not in the profession they left after a long career. Our retired neighbors are a largely untapped resource. They could be re-trained to fill important jobs in industry sectors, while also serving as mentors to younger employees who are just getting started. Efforts to retrain older employees for second careers in service industries, administration and other sectors should be supported.

## Wraparound Services

Workforce development efforts for priority sectors can only be successful if wraparound services – programs that are meant to support the trainees – are also part of the development ecosystem. Data from the state’s 2022 survey, along with workforce program interviews, revealed supports that are needed by those seeking work across the Mid-Hudson Region.

To support job seekers, employers and the growth of Mid-Hudson priority sectors, the state should prioritize the following wraparound services.

**Childcare and eldercare** – High-quality, affordable childcare is perhaps the most dire need for young families in our workforce. Employers and job seekers both listed childcare as a significant barrier to employment. Workforce experts say the availability of childcare has worsened since the pandemic, which forced many daycare facilities to close. That challenge is particularly acute for women. A 2021 report by the National Women’s Law Center found that 1 million women across the United States left the workforce during the pandemic and had not returned, citing

childcare as the leading cause. The region must support eldercare as an essential component of workforce development for the same reasons; many are finding it hard to re-enter the workforce because they must care for an aging parent or other family member.

**Transportation training and assistance** – The region would benefit from innovative transportation programs that connect job seekers with employment centers throughout the Mid-Hudson Region. Programs to expand, enhance or refine public transportation should be supported. The region would also benefit from driver-training programs that target those without a driver’s license. More than half the population, ages 16-25, in some of our small cities do not have a license because driver’s education courses have been eliminated from high schools, or because their families do not have a vehicle. In total, 15 percent of job seekers and 37 percent of employers in the Mid-Hudson said transportation was a barrier to employment. In addition, 27 percent of employers said that candidates lacking a driver’s license was a significant barrier within the region.

**Technology** – Access to a computer, and the skills needed to use one, remains a significant barrier for many job seekers across the region. This problem is especially troubling because so much of the job-application process has moved to online platforms, leaving those without a computer at a disadvantage. To bridge this gap in connectivity, workforce development efforts should account for the following:

- Programs that can train job seekers on basic computer skills, such as writing a resume, establishing a personal email address, using spreadsheets, and more.
- Access to the internet at libraries, community centers and other facilities, along with the adequate marketing of that access to underserved communities.
- Innovative programs that provide computers, or access to computers, for online training courses, attendance at virtual job fairs, or other job-seeking activities.

**Continuing education** – A total of 39 percent of job seekers in the Mid-Hudson said they did not have the right degree, certificate or credential to pursue the work they wanted; 32 percent said they had insufficient

education or training, and 52 percent said that cost was the predominant barrier that prevents them from getting the education they need. Many said they did not know where to start, nor did they know what they needed, to further their education and choose a career. The need for education support was also reflected in the survey of employers, 27 percent of whom said that tuition or education assistance was needed to help the supply of workers meet the demand.

### The region would benefit from programs that help with the following:

- Coaching on careers, college entrance and funding sources.
- Helping job seekers connect with apprenticeships, trade schools, community colleges, four-year colleges and other training programs based on their skills and interests.
- Financial supports for adult learners who have families or must maintain a job while furthering their education.
- On-the-job training programs.

**Innovative communication programs to connect employers and job seekers** – The state’s 2022 survey of job seekers and employers revealed a disconnect that is unhelpful to both sides of the employment equation. More than half of local businesses said they relied on word-of-mouth to find job candidates most successfully. But 40 percent of job seekers said they are at a disadvantage because they do not have a large professional network.

That means the method employers use most often to find workers – connections and word of mouth – is least accessible to those seeking work.

The state survey suggests that our workforce misalignment in the Mid-Hudson Region might be partially caused by poor communication, or marketing that misses its target. Innovative and effective efforts to reach job seekers with accurate, timely information about job openings should be supported.

# Work Groups

The Mid-Hudson REDC has four Work Groups that advance the key pillars of the regional strategy: **LIVE**, **WORK**, **PLAY** and **WORKFORCE**.

## The Work Groups seek to:

1. Drive progress on key components of the MHREDC's strategy.
2. Provide opportunities for stakeholders and members of the public to contribute to the REDC process.
3. Facilitate connections among the business, not-for-profit, academic, and government sectors.
4. Identify barriers and develop solutions across various industry sectors to advance economic development.
5. Apply the lens of diversity, equity, and inclusion to each Work Group so that the Council can be more intentional in how it views the tools that are available to the Council to assist communities that need greater assistance.
6. Inform the full Council on developments and recommendations to advance the regional strategy, recover from COVID-19, and grow the economy.

#### Activity highlights for the past year include:

- The group launched a two-part webinar series, “Connecting NY”, to share valuable information on topics such as Infrastructure Master Planning and Broadband initiatives. The first one – held in April – was titled “What is an Infrastructure Master Plan and Why Should We Care?” and was held in partnership with ESD MHRO staff, Delaware Engineering and the Town of Thompson. The audience was presented with a framework for planning in conjunction with the Town of Thompson, which has implemented their own Master Plan. The webinar had 25 live attendees, and an additional 160 viewings of the recording as of the writing of this report.
- The second webinar in the series was entitled “Improving broadband access and affordability for all New Yorkers” and was presented by the ESD Broadband program office and the New York State ConnectALL Initiative. The devastating toll that the COVID – 19 pandemic has had on the region’s economy has highlighted the increased reliance on broadband for education, work and healthcare. The webinar highlighted Governor Hochul’s new \$1 Billion ‘ConnectALL’ Initiative to bring affordable broadband to millions of New Yorkers. This webinar had 31 live attendees and the recording has been viewed an additional 129 times.

- In June 2022, ESD staff presented a webinar on Rounds 6 and 7 of the RESTORE NY Program. New York State has allotted **\$250 Million** in this year's budget for the RESTORE New York Communities Initiative, a municipal grant program which will provide funding to demolish and/or rehabilitate vacant and abandoned properties. There will be two funding rounds this year that will target disadvantaged communities and rural areas in addition to urban centers. There were 71 live attendees and an additional 144 viewings of the recording.

- In August 2021, an informational webinar was hosted by New York State's Department of State (DOS) on round 6 of the Downtown Revitalization Initiative (DRI) explaining that the REDC Region will award **\$20 Million**—two communities will each receive a **\$10 million** award or one community will receive a **\$20 million** award. 34 attendees gained knowledge on the 5th round of DRI funding.



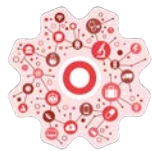

Planning for the region's built environment is crucial for local and regional economic development success. The lack of housing options continues to be a challenge for the region. Private and public partnerships can be beneficial to meeting a variety of housing needs. The **LIVE** Group plans to identify resources and solutions in collaboration with stakeholders, and subsequently disseminate these resources and best practices for improved outcomes for Mid-Hudson communities and the entire region. Now as more details on RESTORE NY, DRI Round 6, and the Governor's New York Forward initiative and FAST NY shovel-ready grant programs are available, the **LIVE** Group, MHREDC, and ESD Mid-Hudson will be partnering on outreach and raising awareness of these important economic development resources.

# WORK



The **WORK** Group's mission is to identify and assess challenges and assets that are key to strengthening the growth, retention and attraction of priority industry clusters in the Mid-Hudson region, including: Life Sciences, Advanced Manufacturing, Information Technology, Financial & Professional Services, Distribution, Film & TV, Innovation, Hospitality, Healthcare, as well as for diverse small business enterprises.

The MHREDC's **WORK** Group continued to make progress in identifying ways to be supportive of private sector growth in the region. Below are highlights of activities from the year.

- From July 2021 through July 2022, the MHREDC and ESD's Mid-Hudson Regional Office (RO) held or participated in 25 virtual and in-person events actively and strategically promoting state resources available for businesses and not-for-profits through the Consolidated Funding Application and other programs. At least one event was held in or in partnership with all seven counties in the region, resulting in more than 800 participants learning about state economic development resources.
- ESD's Mid-Hudson RO staff partnered with The Council of Industry – the leading manufacturer's association in the Mid-Hudson Region – on several webinars, to increase awareness of state resources available for manufacturers to grow and thrive in the state and region.
- Recognizing synergy between the state's newly established Biodefense Commercialization Fund and Westchester County's strategic focus on biosciences, ESD's Mid-Hudson RO facilitated a presentation to Westchester County's Biosciences Task Force. The group consists of start-up companies and established businesses in the biosciences sector as well as other key stakeholders from the region.



- Round XII of the Regional Council initiative has funding available through the Business Incubator and Innovation Hot Spot Support program. It is anticipated that one Innovation Hot Spot will be designated in the region. To highlight this opportunity, ESD's Mid-Hudson RO partnered with ESD's Division of Science, Technology and Innovation (NYSTAR) to hold a webinar for organizations in the region.

- ESD held a Minority and Women-Owned Business Enterprise (MWBE) Virtual Regional Expo, bringing together state agencies and authorities and prime contractors that have a significant presence in the region to provide MWBE firms information on local contracting opportunities.

- With New York State's nation-leading investments in the Offshore Wind industry, there is an opportunity to grow the manufacturing supply chain in the region. The MHREDC's Executive Director Thomas Scaglione has held multiple meetings with economic development partners in the region along with partners at NYSERDA to raise awareness of the Offshore Wind Supply Chain Database, where companies can list themselves and their products and services. The MHREDC Executive Director also represented ESD and the region at the International Offshore Wind Partnering Forum (IPF), the premiere Offshore Wind energy conference in North America.

Affordable housing, transportation, and difficulty attracting and retaining workforce were challenges that pre-date the COVID-19 pandemic, but have become significant barriers to success across industries. The **WORK** Group will continue to partner with the Council's other groups to monitor these challenges and generate solutions, particularly as resources are designed and deployed through ESD's new Office of Strategic Workforce Development. The group will also continue to seek ways to raise awareness of economic development resources for small businesses and MWBEs, building upon the strong work that the Council and ESD engaged in over the past year.

The MHREDC's **PLAY** Group was assembled and activated this year, with members from throughout the Mid-Hudson Region. Below are highlights of the Council's **PLAY** initiative from the year.

- Key infrastructure investments by Port Authority NY/NJ (PANYNJ) pre-pandemic helped to expand and modernize New York Stewart International Airport and included robust marketing efforts to re-energize New York Stewart International Airport. These investments were just what was needed to woo existing domestic carriers, Frontier Airlines and Allegiant to expand their service to new destinations and has successfully allowed PANYNJ to attract a new international carrier to Stewart, PLAY Airlines. PLAY Airlines will begin offering daily service in June 2022 from NY Stewart International Airport to Reyjavik, Iceland and other European destinations.
- Governor Hochul announced in her “Bring Back Tourism, Bring Back Jobs” initiative a **\$450 million** investment to provide assistance for tourism workers and small businesses, and introduced an aggressive domestic and international ad campaign. A new I LOVE NY advertising campaign will run spots in domestic markets and digitally to select global markets. I LOVE NY has partnered with international tour operators to create and promote New York State and New York City travel packages.

- The Heritage Trail now runs approximately 19.5 miles from Harriman to East Main Street in Middletown with roughly 500,000 people using it each year for running, biking, hiking, and environmental and natural studies. It has access points in Monroe, Chester, Harriman, Wawayanda, and Goshen, with other access points to be added.
- The Open Space Institute (OSI) in partnership with Orange County is building a new 9.8-mile trail that will span from Camp La Guardia in the Town of Chester to the Moodna train trestle in Salisbury Mills.
- In addition to **\$20 million** in state funding, the Hudson Highland Fjord project will also be funded by **\$14 million** from the New York City Department of Environmental Protection and **\$36 million** in private charitable contributions.
- The Hudson Valley Tourism Group has developed a craft beverage map which guides visitors to the region to wineries, distilleries, breweries and cideries.
- Governor Hochul presided over the opening of the new Sojourner Truth State Park in Kingston in April of 2022 in honor of both Black History and Women's History month. The Governor also announced **\$3.5 Million** for additional park improvements.

- Through Round XI of the CFA, projects awarded through Market NY that market the region included:
  - The Dutchess Tourism and Hudson Valley Region will develop and promote their Inclusive and Expanded Marketing Project that will attract diverse visitors and demonstrate that the Hudson Valley is an inclusive, welcoming destination through research-driven marketing campaigns. Additionally, it will establish new target markets in locations that have direct flights to NY Stewart International Airport.
  - Sullivan Catskills Visitors Association will develop and initiate “Beyond Summer: Extending the Catskill Tourism Season”, a three-pronged event and marketing strategy that aims to extend the upstate New York tourism season into the shoulder season of fall and early winter.

Workforce attraction and retention, transportation, and housing also present major challenges in industries under the Council's **PLAY** initiative, which is a theme across many industries and is not unique to the Mid-Hudson or New York State. As such, the group is eager to identify and learn from best practices in other regions, states, and even countries to address these issues. The group is also looking to plan a webinar series where guest speakers in the **PLAY** initiative industries address challenges identified by the group and share successful approaches that may be replicable for businesses in the region.

The **WORKFORCE** Group’s mission is to develop, attract and retain a quality workforce in the region, focusing on connecting short and long-term industry talent needs with the Mid-Hudson’s many educational institutions to create a pipeline for employment.

The **WORKFORCE** Group expanded their activities significantly this year, recognizing the urgent challenges faced by businesses across industries throughout the region. Some highlights include:

- The **WORKFORCE** Group held a total of 5 webinars with 367 individuals attending the live presentations. The recordings were viewed another 812 times (as of 6/30/2022) and are housed on the Mid-Hudson REDC website along with handouts and slides, as a resource for businesses, economic developers, and workforce development organizations. The webinars, part of a series entitled “Mid-Hudson Workforce Solutions” – provided actionable ideas for workforce solutions across a variety of topics including: workforce development funding; Greyston’s Open Hiring Model for talent attraction and retention; child care resources for employers; and NYS Department of Labor recruitment resources.
- In partnership with the Child Care Council of Westchester, the MHREDC crafted the Mid-Hudson priorities for the Child Care Desert funding program announced by the Governor.
- The EDA’s Good Jobs Challenge offered an opportunity for organizations throughout the Mid-Hudson Region to solicit funding for impactful workforce development programs. ESD’s Mid-Hudson Regional office was able to support four applications: Hudson Valley Healthcare Career Pathways; New York Community Colleges Energy Equity Consortium; Driving towards Better Careers and a Better Future; and Workforce Development – Film, Media, Arts Industries.

- ESD's President, CEO, and Commissioner Hope Knight served as the keynote speaker at Westchester County Association's (WCA) Regional Workforce Summit in April of this year, sharing highlights from the NYS FY2023 budget, which includes establishing an Office of Strategic Workforce Development within ESD.
- ESD Mid-Hudson RO staff attended WCA's Healthcare Job Fair and connected directly with 24 employers to promote the state's workforce development programs. This approach is a good model for ESD to connect with more organizations with state workforce development resources. NYSDOL, the Child Care Council of Westchester, and the Westchester-Putnam Workforce Development Board also attended to promote their resources to employers and job seekers.
- ESD Mid-Hudson RO staff as well as members of the Mid-Hudson REDC have participated in meetings of workforce groups, including Hudson Valley Pattern for Progress's Job Connection Task Force (JCTF) and WCA's Talent Consortium, which both proved to be productive forums for the dissemination of information on state workforce resources and initiatives.

The MHREDC **WORKFORCE** Group collaborated to create the plan which resulted in the highlights listed above, all of which was a significant expansion of the work of the group and the Council from previous years. While much was accomplished, there is much more to do. The MHREDC and the work group are eager to support implementation of ESD's new Office of Strategic Workforce Development and raise awareness about funding programs to organizations in the region. Going forward, the group anticipates holding a pilot virtual meeting of workforce development partners to share best practices, modeled after the WCA's success with their Talent Consortium, where several employers in need of workforce would give presentations on their workforce needs to workforce partners, who in turn disseminate the information to their thousands of contacts. The webinars were well-attended, and feedback was overwhelmingly positive. The group will look to continue this approach and identify additional topics and speakers and will also continue recording the webinars and ensuring they are short, clear, and actionable. The vast majority of viewers watched the recorded versions and not the live presentations. The group will look at ways to systematize feedback on webinars as well to lead to continuous improvement.

# PUBLIC OUTREACH AND ENGAGEMENT

**The Mid-Hudson REDC has proactively increased relationships with elected officials and community stakeholders to ensure participation in the REDC initiative and to access funding programs available to support economic development.**

Since July 2021, the MHREDC has held four public meetings, 17 CFA information sessions promoting rounds 11 and 12 of the CFA, and held or participated in another 27 either virtual or in-person events to promote state economic development resources. In total, these events had over 3,100 participants.

The MHREDC has actively sought to increase its outreach efforts over the past year, in close partnership with Empire State Development's (ESD) Mid-Hudson Regional Office. The multifaceted outreach campaign involves several e-newsletters sent to more than 2,000 stakeholders promoting economic development resources for businesses, not-for-profits, and municipalities. Open rates for e-newsletter editions are generally around 30%, which is about average. The average click rate for these communications is 8.5%, which is considered better than average. Over time the communications strategy will be refined, seeking to increase the open rate and click rate of communications.

The Council has been hosting webinars throughout the months of May, June, and July, in close collaboration with local economic development partners, and has recorded all of the presentations and made them available on the MHREDC webpage. As of the writing of this report in June 2022, eight virtual CFA Information

Sessions have been held and recorded, with live attendance for each ranging from eight to 81; the recordings have been viewed an additional 247 times.

As part of the Round 12 outreach strategy, ESD's Mid-Hudson RO staff have also attended many events put on by local economic development organizations and business associations to reach farther and wider to promote the CFA and other state economic development resources, connecting with an additional 800+ stakeholders. The Council has continued to be thoughtful about its website, ensuring it is current and provides for a clear and simple user experience for organizations looking to find information about the REDC process, resources, and upcoming events.

**Through the work groups, public meetings, and presentations, the Council will continue to provide ways to keep the public informed about the REDC process and state economic development resources.**

# Previously Funded CFA Projects





The Mid-Hudson REDC reviews and identifies priority projects that align with and implement its **LIVE**, **WORK**, and **PLAY** strategy. Since 2011, the Council has identified 158 priority projects that have been awarded an investment from the state, with 77.2% complete or progressing. The Council endorses projects as priorities that have strong alignment with the regional strategy, state priorities, and will have a positive economic impact on communities, counties, and the region.

The leverage ratio represents the total project cost divided by the total capital grant funds awarded. The leverage ratio for Mid-Hudson priority projects is 15.4:1, demonstrating the Council's commitment to maximizing the impact of public dollars.

The pages that follow include a map showing the approximate location of priority projects, as well as summary tables showing the current status of CFA-awarded projects.

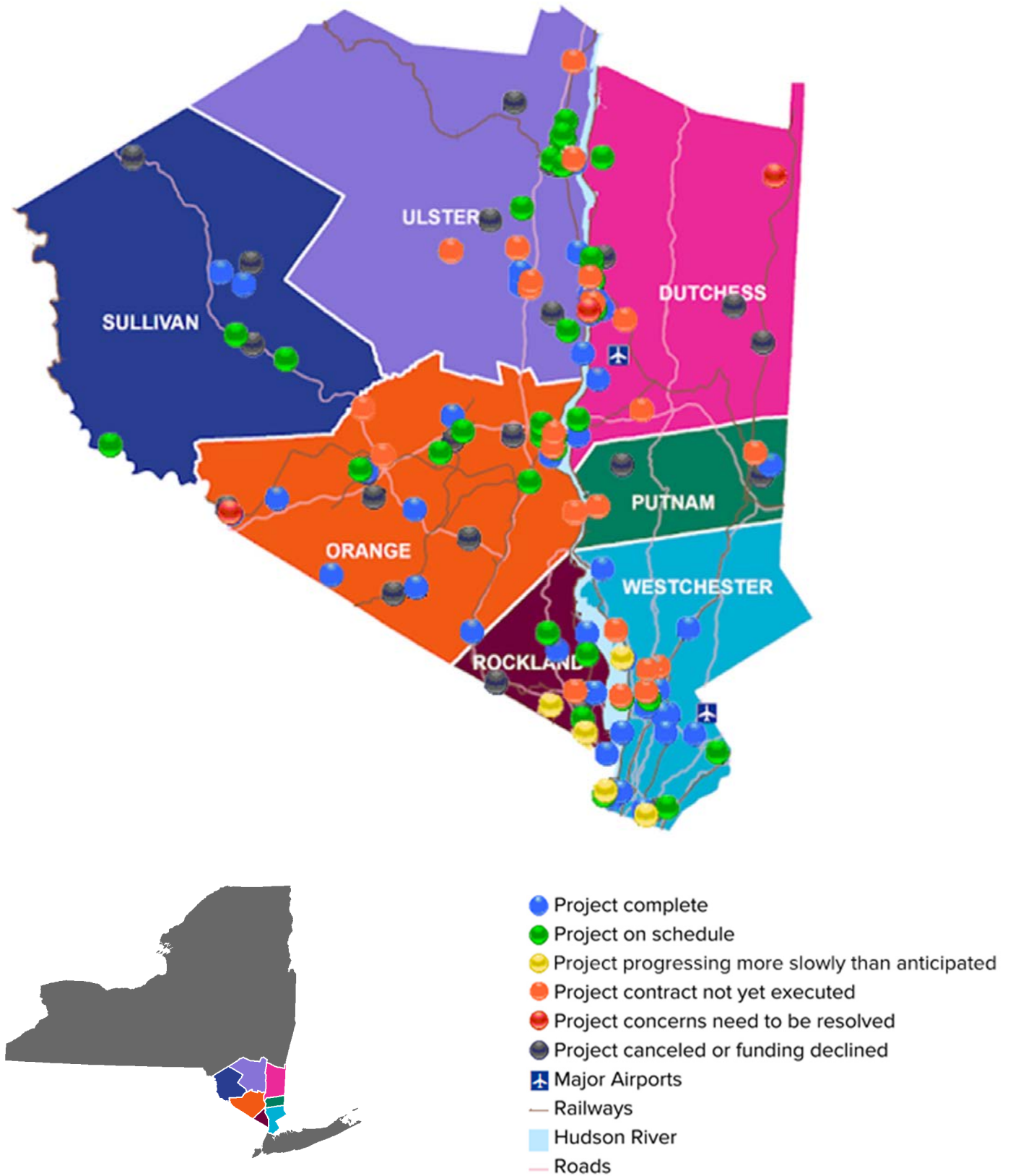

# All Past Projects Awarded CFA Funding

Many Mid-Hudson awarded projects from past funding rounds continue to make progress and implement the Mid-Hudson REDC's **LIVE, WORK, PLAY** strategy. Of the 1,054 awards that have been granted over the years, 86.5% are complete or progressing. The ratio of total project cost to total awards for all Mid-Hudson CFA projects is 8.2:1. The State awards through the REDC process are projected to generate more than \$4.1 Billion in economic activity in the region.
